JIFFY DEVIL'S FOOD CAKE

1 ½ cups all purpose flour
3 Tbsp. cocoa
½ tsp. salt
1 tsp. vinegar
1 cup cold water
1 cup sugar
1 tsp. baking soda
1/3 cup melted shortening
1 tsp. vanilla

Preheat oven to 350° F. Sift flour, cocoa and baking soda together. Add the salt and mix well. Add the vinegar to the cold water and then add this mixture to the dry ingredients. Add the sugar, shortening and vanilla and stir to combine. Pour into an 8" x 8" greased baking pan and bake for 30 minutes.

4 cups icing sugar, 1 tbsp. vanilla, 1 cup chopped walnuts or pecans (optional)
Beat until very smooth. Quickly pour into prepared 9" x 13" pan lined with parchment paper. Put in fridge for several hours. Cut into squares and store in airtight container.
