OBJECTIVES OF THE JUNIOR FAIRS

1. To supplement and encourage junior activities as organized in Carleton.
2. To improve the educational value of the Fairs.
3. To encourage youth to become open class exhibitors.
4. To stimulate the interest of youth in the Fair working as 4-H members representing the 4-H program.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Participation in the Junior Fair is open to 4-H members in the Carleton 4-H program who are between the ages of 10 and 21 years of age as of January 1, 2007.
2. 4-H club members may compete at more than one Class 'A' or Class 'B' Fair in the same class in any one year.
3. Junior Fair Exhibitors may exhibit in the open classes of each Fair by complying with the regulations of that fair.
4. The Junior Fair Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry which, in their opinion, is not in the best interest of the Junior Fair.
5. All participants in the Junior Fair are expected to act and co-operate by showing good manners and behaviour at all times. Persons not complying with this rule will be dealt with by the Committee.

6. 4-H livestock exhibitors are encouraged to display a 4-H sign whenever possible above their entries the day on which they show their animals.
7. 4-H livestock entries must comply with the health standards of that fair.

All 4-H members in the Vernon Dairy 4-H club must participate in an Achievement Program approved by the Carleton 4-H Association in order to receive credit for their 4-H project.

DIVISION 'A'
LOCAL BEEF ACHIEVEMENT DAY
Friday, September 28
10:00 p.m. - 11:00 - ARENA

All 4-H members in the Metcalfe Beef 4-H club must participate in an Achievement Program approved by the Carleton 4-H Association in order to receive credit for their 4-H project.

1. Both dairy and beef calves should be on the grounds and in place by **8:00 a.m.** on the appropriate day.
2. For all **Dairy Classes**, 4-H members should wear clean white pants and shirts, safe footwear (no running shoes) and 4-H hatbands. No hats will be allowed.
3. For all **Beef Classes**, 4-H members must wear black pants, a white shirt, safe footwear (no running shoes) and a show harness or belt clip. No hats will be allowed.
4. **All 4-H livestock projects must be trained and prepared by the 4-H member only.**
5. Under no circumstances should an animal exhibiting signs of transmittable disease, be taken to Achievement Day. In the event of an animal unable to participate in the Achievement Program, because of health problems, the member will be given credit for completion of the club. Written notification of a health problem must be given to the Fairs Committee Chair or designate the day of the show. The member will be allowed to show another 4-H member's calf in the Showmanship Class. Animals unable to show at Achievement Day will not be eligible to attend the 4-H County Championship Show at Metcalfe or the Eastern Ontario/Western Quebec 4-H Regional Championship Show.
6. The 4-H committee reserves the right to obtain the opinion of a veterinarian in the event of a questionable situation regarding transmittable diseases. The opinion of the vet will be final.

2007 4-H CLUB CALVES
ACHIEVEMENT PROGRAM

1. Open to 2007 4-H members with a calf project.
2. Showmanship classes only will be judged in the beef section. Confirmation and showmanship classes will be judged in the dairy section.

3. Creditable entries are eligible for the Carleton 4-H Championship Show on Friday, September 28.
4. Trophies will be presented to the Top Overall Showpersons and First Year Showpersons in each of the Dairy and Beef Shows.

SHEEP SHOW
FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 28
AGRI-VIEW BUILDING - TIME - TBA

1. Open to Carleton 4-H members enrolled in a 4-H sheep project in 2007.
2. All lambs to be in pens when judging begins.
3. All breeds except Leicesters and North Country Cheviot must be shown with 1 inch (2.5 cm) of fleece or less.
4. Award Trophy to be presented to top showperson.
CLASS I - 1 market lamb
CLASS II - Ewe-"Full Mouth Milk Teeth"
(all 8 temporary incisors)
CLASS III - Novice Sheep Showmanship
(10 - 11 yr. olds)
CLASS IV - Junior Sheep Showmanship
(12 - 14 year olds)
CLASS V - Senior Sheep Showmanship
(15 years & older)
CLASS VI - Grand Champion Showmanship

SECTION I - INDIVIDUAL INTER-CLUB
4-H CALF COMPETITION

1. Open to **all** Carleton 4-H members successfully completing their nominated June 1st, 2007 project shown at local Achievement Days in Carleton.
2. Individual calf classes for the breed will only be held provided there are sufficient numbers of animals. Any additions or deletions will be made known well in advance of the show.
3. The judges will place the calves in each section in Group A, B or C on the basis of type.
4. All calves to be on the grounds by **10:30 a.m.** and to be tied in their designated spaces as indicated by the Carleton 4-H Association Fair Program Committee.

SECTION IV - TIE UP COMPETITION

1. Open to all 4-H Clubs exhibiting livestock at the Championship Show (i.e. - Dairy, Beef, Sheep)
2. Judging to take place several times while the 4-H livestock projects are at Championship Show.
3. Judging to be based on:
 - a. Appearance - General appearance of animals, including bedding, feed, equipment as deemed necessary, safety and cleanliness.
 - b. Attitude - Attitude of members, courtesy, neatness, completeness of information.
4. 4-H leaders have received copies of the judging criteria
5. All 4-H members must tie their calves together as a club unit. No exceptions will be granted.
6. A club unit will consist of at least five (5) animals.

Prize Money: 1st-\$15; 2nd-\$10; 3rd-\$8; 4th-\$6 and \$4 to the remaining entries
