17. **SNOW JAR -**
Get a clean glass jar with a lid that screws tightly, various plastic waterproof figures, aluminum foil, plumber's glue "GOOP" (a kind of glue) or any other waterproof glue, distilled water to avoid mould growth in the water, and glitter or glitter confetti. Do not use paper confetti as it will fall apart in the water. You will also need decorations for the base such as beads, sequins, bows etc. Use small figurines to set up your scene. Place the design in the centre of the underside of the lid, leaving plenty of space around the edges, so the lid will crew into the jar. Glue the figurines to the underside of the lid and let dry. Place 2 tablespoons of glitter or small pieces of foil in the jar. Slowly add the water until the jar is filled 3/4 to the top. Place some glue around the edge of the underside of the lid. Gently put the glued figure(s) upside down into the water. Screw the lid onto the jar. Turn upright and allow to dry. You can also wrap the tightened lid with teflon thread sealing tape to prevent leaks. This is optional depending on how tightly the lid attaches. Once dry, swirl the water to make a snowstorm.
